Caregivers Checklist: Working with Schools

Are you raising or providing primary care for a child or youth of a relative or family friend? This checklist is for kinship caregivers who are enrolling students and working with schools. I understand how to enroll my student in school:

- □ I have contacted the school division's enrollment office and know what I need to provide to enroll my student(s). Examples of enrollment paperwork: custody order; affidavit; power of attorney; others.
- □ I have let the school know my role as educational decision maker for my student, in writing.

I understand how to communicate with schools:

- □ I know how to access my student's course information online. Log in info:
- □ I know who my student's teachers are and how to reach them. Contact info:
- □ I know how to access my student's grades, including status of assignments between report cards.
- □ I know who my student's school counselor is and how to contact them. Contact info:

- □ I know if my student has a 504 plan or Individualized Education Program (IEP) and I have a copy of the plan(s).
- □ I know how to request an evaluation for disability/special needs if I have concerns about my student's learning, behavior or social emotional needs.
- I know who manages my student's 504 plan or special education services and supports.

□ I know who will be helping to plan for my student's transition to work or learning after high school.
