The Virginia Department of Education, Office of Special Education Instructional Services, in partnership with the Training and Technical Assistance Center at George Mason University, invites school teams of three to five participants that includes general education teachers, reading specialists, special education teachers, instructional support personnel, or administrators to attend a virtual three-part webinar series entitled *Sound Off: Boosting Phonological Awareness Instruction & Assessment.*

February 17, 2021, 3-4:30 p.m.

Webinar 1: Essentials of Phonological Awareness and Instruction

This session provides an understanding of the development of phonological awareness and its subset, phonemic awareness and how they impact learning to read and spell. Participants will walk away with strategies for effective phonological awareness instruction.

February 24, 2021, 3-4:30 p.m.

Webinar 2: Phonological Awareness: Assessment and Data Analysis This session provides participants with several tools and methods for phonological awareness assessment and an understanding of how to use the results to inform instruction.

March 3, 2021, 3-4:30 p.m.

<u>Webinar 3: Phonological Awareness: Program Evaluation & Future Planning</u> In this session participants will analyze their current phonological practices and identify strengths, opportunities, and next steps for improvement.

Upon completion, school teams will be eligible to apply through a competitive application process for up to \$2,000 in grant monies to purchase materials to support phonological awareness instruction and assessment in their school. Out of those

schools who apply, 25 school teams will be selected to receive this grant funding. An informational session regarding the application process will be scheduled following the webinar series to share details and answer questions.
